For how long and how often are my workers exposed?



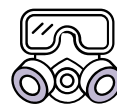
How effective are my current controls?

If you are not certain if airborne contaminants in your workplace exceed the exposure limits, you must conduct air monitoring.

Air monitoring can show you:

- how much your workers are being exposed
- which processes or products are the source of exposure
- if your control measures are working.



Employers must ensure that workers and others at the workplace are not exposed to levels of airborne contaminants above the workplace exposure limits.
