Cranes

Non-slewing mobile crane (CN)

This licence authorises the operation of a non-slewing mobile crane with a capacity exceeding 3 tonnes.

A non-slewing mobile crane is a mobile crane that can lift loads vertically but cannot rotate (slew) the load sideways. It is mounted on a vehicle or tracks and is fitted with a boom that raises and lowers only, meaning the crane itself does not turn; instead, the entire machine must be repositioned to move the load sideways, making it suitable for straight up-and-down lifting tasks where lateral movement is not required.

A non-slewing mobile crane is used for:

- lifting loads straight up and down
- simple lifting tasks where sideways movement is not needed
- work on construction or industrial sites with low to moderate risk.

If you hold a slewing mobile crane operation licence you may also operate a non-slewing mobile crane.

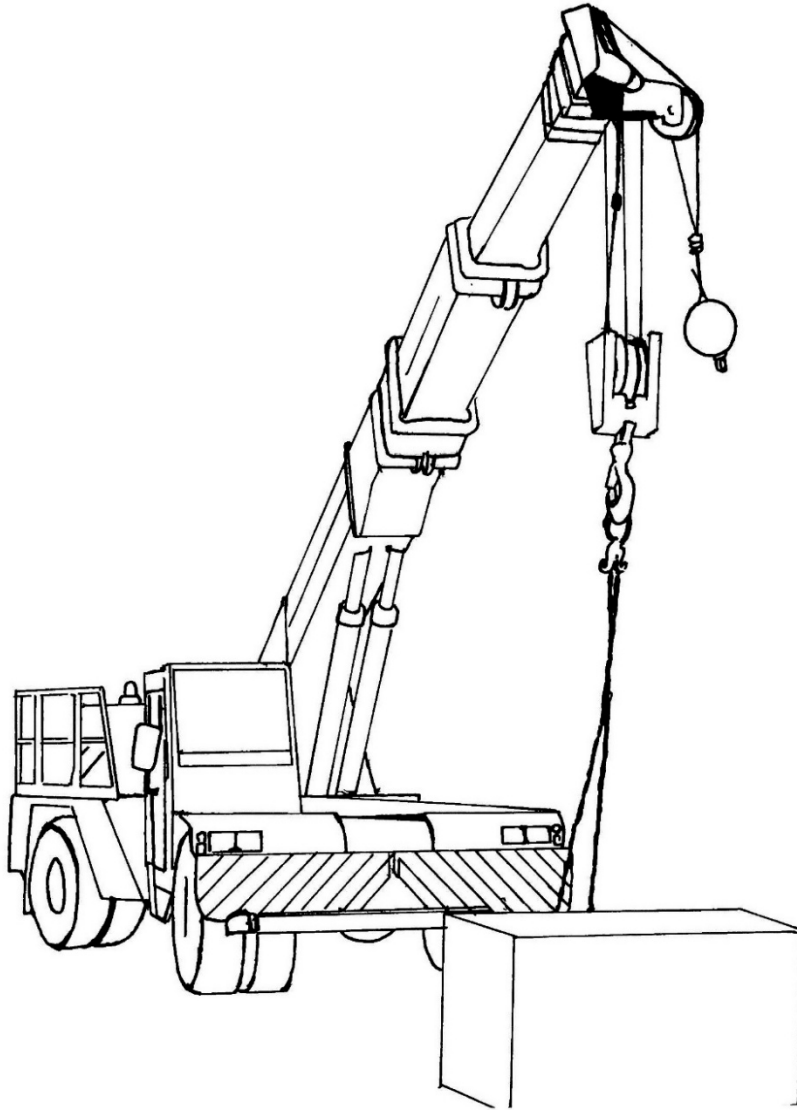


Figure Non-slewing mobile crane (includes lattice and hydraulic boom types)
